

Structure

Method 1: Manual Upload

1. Download the plugin's ZIP file from a trusted source.
2. Log in to your WordPress dashboard.
3. Go to "Extensions" -> "Add" -> "Upload Extension".
4. Choose the ZIP file and click "Install Now".
5. Activate the plugin after installation.

Method 2: Using an FTP Client

1. Download and extract the ZIP file of the plugin to your computer.
2. Connect to your server via an FTP client (such as FileZilla).
3. Upload the plugin folder to the /wp-content/plugins/ directory.
4. Go to your WordPress dashboard, then "Plugins" and activate the plugin.



Version

The current version of the plugin is 1.0.1.

This is the first version deployed in PROD at various ITU-R sites.



Accordion

To use this block, simply click on the "+" button in the WordPress editor and select the block.



Once the Block is inserted, it appears as follows in the edit area:



The block has a box for the title and a box for the content.

The block also offers different settings that can be edited in the right-hand "Block Settings" menu

Accordion Settings

This will open the accordion by default when the page loads.
If the accordion is open in the editor, it will also be open on the page

Clone / Open

Please choose the size of the title that will be displayed, H2, H3 or H4

TITLE TAG

H2

You can specify an HTML Anchor to be able to call the content of the Accordion directly from a url
(www.itu.int/page_name/#HTML_Anchor)

HTML ANCHOR

Add anchor...

Show Title

Open / Close

Display the accordion open or closed when the page is opened in Frontend

Title Tag

Manage the size of the title from H2 to H4


HTML Anchor

Assign an Anchor to the selected block to be able to call it directly from a url. (e.g. www.itu.int/nom_page/#nom_accordéon)

Show Title

Enabled by default. It allows you to hide the title. This can also be used to nest blocks one below the other on a page and to show them only when an HTML Anchor is called.






Cards Modal

To use this block, simply click on the "+" button in the WordPress editor and select the block.




Once the Block is inserted, it appears as follows in the edit area:



This Block has three zones. A title box, a description box and a box for the content visible when selecting "add content"

Add Content (in Modal)



This Block accepts the insertion of any type of WordPress content and element.

Code Editor

To use this block, simply click on the "+" button in the WordPress editor and select the block.



Once the Block is inserted, it appears as follows in the edit area:




This block allows editing of Java, jQuery, and CSS scripts.

By default, WordPress remove script and style tags in the built-in editor for users who don't have "Super Admin" rights

To avoid changing security rules in wp-config. The rule allowing the editor and contributor to be able to open a page without these tags skipping has been introduced in the plugin.


In the block settings, it is important to select the language used so that the script generates the right





Floorplan

To use this block, simply click on the "+" button in the WordPress editor and select the block.




Once the Block is inserted, it appears as follows in the edit area:

This block has a field for the title of the Category, a field for the title of the different pieces, a field for the images and a field for the description

In the block settings in the right-hand menu, it is also possible to add a category to add other parts.




To use this block, simply click on the "+" button in the WordPress editor and select the block.




Once the Block is inserted, it appears as follows in the edit area:



In the block settings it is possible to change the display, Horizontal or Vertical






